## Where did the Easter bunny come from?

Yesterday my daughter asked me about the Easter bunny. Where did the idea of an Easter bunny come from? What about the Easter egg?

### Dear Irwin,

The Easter bunny is really a hare which, according to legends of far-off Egypt, is a symbol of the moon. Easter falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon that occurs after the twenty-first day of March. Put this together, and we have an Easter bunny.

The egg is a symbol of new life and, as such, can be called "resurrection food." For centuries, dyed eggs have been exchanged as a token of peace at Easter. The Egyptians, long before the time of Christ, had the custom of giving eggs to each other as gifts. The egg also held an important place in the Jewish Passover meal.

In some parts of the world, children carry baskets and torches and sing Easter carols as they go from place to place. They are given brightly colored eggs to put in their baskets. Many people compete with one another in coloring and decorating their eggs to demonstrate their faith in Christ's resurrection.

In other places, eggs are carried to church and blessed by the priests. The eggs are taken home and placed in the center of the table as the main dish at the Easter feast. Visitors to the house during Easter week are offered this sacred food of the resurrection.

## Knights of Columbus Celebrates 125th Anniversary



On March 29, 1882, the Connecticut State Legislature officially chartered the Knights of Columbus, a fraternal benefit society founded by Father Michael J. McGivney with a group of parishioners in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven. Still true to its founding principles of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity 125 years later, the Knights of Columbus has grown to the largest lay Catholic organization in the world with more than 1.7 million members worldwide

and over 86,000 members in Texas.

Throughout its history, the Knights of Columbus has been an effective advocate and defender of civil and religious rights for all. Among the initiatives that the Knights have been most active in recent years are the inclusion of "under God" in the Pledge of Allegiance, and the principle of Right to Life from conception to natural death. The organization has also contributed billions of dollars and millions of hours of volunteer service to local, state, national, and international charities, community service and patriotic projects, and the support of the Clergy, Seminarians in training for the Priesthood, and the projects and programs of the Holy Father, our Bishops and Parishes.
