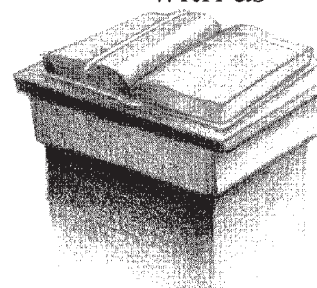

Have no fear.

How seriously can we take that statement of Jesus? Does God understand modern life? We aren't talking about fallen sparrows here. Did Jesus' audiences have to deal with choking mortgages? Did families in Jerusalem get transferred away from their homes? Did they worry about health insurance? Did they face wars? Were they shocked to consider the effects of pollution? Did they wonder what the next generation would face?

In fact, their problems weren't so different. Their country was occupied by a foreign government. They died young. The right disease could run rampant through their family or their village. Mothers and daughters died in childbirth. Elders were revered because they weren't common; most family tables were not blessed enough to have them. And what could farmers do in the face of weather or pests? If crops were bad, food would be scarce.

This is not a debate about whose problems were bigger. It's a matter of seeing that God does not abandon us. If hope could be mustered in the time of Jesus, it's worth our attention now. We can push even further back. No matter how bad it got, Jeremiah knew God would deliver him.

Nobody had more reason to complain than Jeremiah. He looked at the treacherous political events ahead and spoke directly about them. He saw the mess the king-

dom of Judah was in, and he spelled it out in sickening detail. He saw Jerusalem was going to fall. He warned. For his unflinching eye and honesty, he was thrown into a pit. And what he warned about took place.

Still we hear from him: "Sing to the LORD; praise the LORD! For he has delivered the life of the needy from the hands of evildoers!" (Jeremiah 20:13).

We do not always know how or when, but we know God is for us. Jeremiah also described God's restoration of the exiled people. *And what he spoke about took place.*
